Survival Kit Final Project

As your final project you will be working to design a survival kit for a person who is moving out of the family home to live independently. The kit will contain common household items representing characteristics or helps in successfully living an independent lifestyle.

GUIDELINES

- 1. Your kit must contain 12 items.
- 2. The items themselves are not usually what you need to survive (not food, address book, bath towels, etc.) They represent clues that are necessary for successful independent living.
- Only 2 of the items can come from the suggested list verbatim Note: You can use items in the suggested list if you create a different description of how they will help you OR you can use the way it will help you but use a different object to put in the kit.
- 4. Provide a description of what the item will do to help the person survive.
- 5. Provide a container, even something as simple as a ziplock bag, to hold the items.
- 6. Bonus points can be earned in the following ways:
 - More than 12 items-Credit only given if the use is also provided
 - Unique packaging of the items
