Our names identify who we are but not what we become. In this assignment you will be using your name as an outline, then filing in the letters with things about you and your family. This assignment allows you to express your creativity and individuality. However, there are some guidelines, so that I can assign a grade to your work.

Letter 1: (5 points)

- Should include words that describe you and your family members
- Use a different color ink and/or font for each person represented by the character traits you use

## Letter 2: (5 points)

- This letter will have pictures in it
- The pictures should be of things you and your family do together
- These pictures may represent your family bonds

#### Letter 3: ( 5 points)

- This letter can have words and/or pictures in it
- This letter will represent your value system
- This letter may also represent values your family holds
- There will be at least 3 values represented in this letter

Letter 4: (If your name only has three letters use your middle or last name initial) (5 points)

- This letter can have words and/or pictures in it
- This letter will represent your goals

Letter 5 and any other after: (optional)

- This letter can have words and/or pictures in it
- This letter can represent your likes and dislikes
- This letter can represent your needs and wants

# Any letter that does not have specific instructions assigned to it can be decorated or colored to your liking. It could simply be filled in with your favorite color.

Each letter is worth 5 points each. An additional 10 points will be put towards neatness and creativity.
