

- Energy Efficiency
  - Heat is lost through windows
  - Or heat enter through windows during summer





## For direct sunlight Best materials are metallized or have a white backing that can reflect the greatest amount of sunshine, while shading the interior

 The best insulation is honeycomb blinds with a double layer that traps air in the honeycomb cells



# Lighting

- A key component to any interior
- Can add whimsy
- Creates ambiance and drama and sets the mood for the room





